... Christina: For many New Yorkers finding a place to live is more than tough.

Dari: That's not slowing down competition between landlords trying to lure in renters with high-end amenities. We checked out some of the best at what of what the city has to offer. A 24-hour doorman, small exercise room, are just some of the amenities traditionally offered in many of new york's high-rise buildings.

Dolly Lenz: I think it all started when they could get people to go to the fringe areas.

Dari: those don't quite cut it for sophisticated renters tired of being cramped in small apartments. >> we all live in little spaces. we want an extension of our living space.

Dari: a few years ago renters would have had to get an apartment, a gym and a social club to obtain the lifestyle you can get an apartment buildings like this one, The Aldyn, right here in Riverside Boulevard. This high-end building features a bowling alley, a cafe, a 40,000 square foot state-of-the-art gym with a rock climbing wall, a 70-foot pool, squash and basketball courts, a golf simulator and yes a pilates room.

Dolly Lenz: We want the party room and we want the dining room and a movie the movie theater but it's almost like it's part of my apartment.

Dari: If movies are your thing, you might want to check out MiMA at 42nd st. and 10th avenue. It features an indoor theater and an outdoor area. it also has a game room and internet cafe, multiple lounges, a catering kitchen and a full service spa.

Daria Salusbury: For renters willing to pay top dollar and are looking for something super, they have separate tower residences. They have their own lobby with their own staff.

Dari: if you are still a kid at heart he might want to move to the west chelsea hotspot where residents can shoot pool, play classic idiot games like pac-man in the arcade or chill out with live music each on the performance stage in the lobby. If you have an even more sophisticated pallet, 34 Leonard in Tribeca might need more your style. They have a wine cellar and every apartment has a private cabinet for 300 bottles. Lavish amenities as you can imagine in these buildings don't come cheap. Prices range from just under \$4000 to up to 40 grand a month.
